



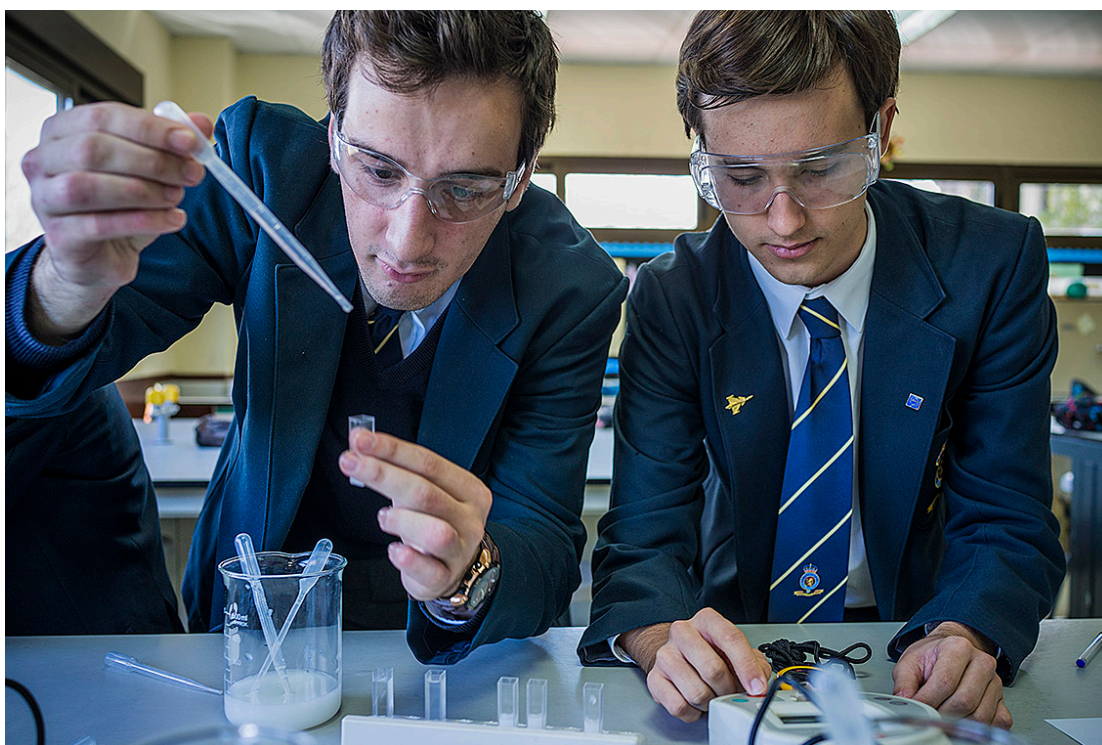

Students from King's College in Madrid have received 177 offers from Russell Group universities, including Oxford and Cambridge

This year, a total of 23 pupils have received an offer to study at one of the top 10 universities in the world (QS World Top 10). Among them, one student has been offered a place at the University of Oxford to study Medicine, while another sixth former has been given the opportunity to study Engineering at the University of Cambridge.



In the past weeks, universities have started to send their offers to Sixth Form students all around the world. So far, King's College students from Madrid have received offers to study at some of the most prestigious institutions in the world, including the University of Oxford, the University of Cambridge and Stanford University in the USA – all of which are ranked among the top 10 universities in the world (QS Ranking 2018).

King's College students from Madrid have received 177 offers from the “Russell Group” (Top 24 UK universities) to date, although there are some universities that still have to announce decisions. UCL and Imperial (both QS World Top 10) have made 13 and 7

offers respectively thus far, meaning that there are a total of 23 pupils with offers from a world top 10 institution.

King's College London (QS World Top 25) has made 30 offers to King's pupils - the most of any university to date.

Edinburgh (QS World Top 25) has made two offers so far to non-European applicants, while EU applicants are still waiting for the universities to announce their offers for them.

About King's College schools

Sir Roger Fry, knighted in 2012 by Queen Elizabeth II for promoting British education internationally, founded the first King's College school in 1969. Since then, the prestigious educational institution has grown to a total of nine schools in the UK, Spain (Madrid, Alicante, Murcia and Elche), Latvia and Panama.

All of the schools offer pupils a quality British education based on the National Curriculum of England and Wales, which emphasises strong academic values through hands-on learning. Pupils from the age of 18 months to 18 years old are taught by native and British trained teachers. The educational model of the schools is characterised by its rigorous and broad curriculum, its interdisciplinary approach and its emphasis on practical learning, exploration and the active participation of students.

Testament to the exceptional academic and pastoral standards that the schools embed is the Independent School Inspectorate's (ISI) recognition of "Excellence" in every category in their latest reports (March 2017).
